- Complete a program in one year with primarily distance learning

The School of Physical Therapy at Western is the first university in Canada to offer a clinical masters program in Manipulation designed to foster advanced clinical skills, and professional and research competencies. This one-year program will be offered primarily by distance learning with eight weeks of on-site intensive manual and manipulative training spread out over the year. The clinical skills component of the masters program will be taught by Jackie Sadi, FCAMT, along with other FCAMT instructors including Lenerdene Levesque, Martin Chisholm, David Walton, Heather Gillis, Anita Gross, Corinne Roos and Rob Werstine. Other Western faculty members contributing to the program include Bert Chesworth, PhD PT, FCAMT, Trevor Birmingham, PhD PT, Canada Research Chair in Musculoskeletal Rehabilitation, and Dianne Bryant, PhD, Director of the Facility for the Advancement of Musculoskeletal Health Research.

Candidates will need to have:

- 1) A minimum of a baccalaureate degree in physical therapy with a B standing in the final two years;
- 2) A minimum of two years of clinical experience in orthopaedics;
- 3) Completed the Level II Upper and Lower courses in the CPA Orthopaedic Division Advanced Orthopaedic Manual and Manipulative Physiotherapy
- 4) 30 hours of documented mentoring.

The School of Physical Therapy is committed to the development of advanced clinical, professional, and research skills in orthopaedics. The deadline for applications for September 2010 is March 5, 2010. Applications may be considered until June 30, 2010 if space is available.
